

Message From Council President

As the year draws to a close, we asked our Council President, Chris Rivera, to reflect on the challenges and opportunities our church is facing....

What brought my family to St. Bart's was loss and hope. After losing our daughter Zienna in 2021, we were searching for a church home that was both accepting and aligned with our values—a place where we could find healing and belonging. When we welcomed our daughter Zelinne in 2022, we made a promise to show our gratitude to God by raising her to know and love Him.

We would often drive by St. Bart's and see people lined up for fresh produce and the food pantry. That image spoke to us. It showed us that this was not just a church asking for tithes, but a church that gives back—a church that serves its community with compassion and purpose.

One sunny Sunday in September 2023, my family decided to visit. From the moment we walked through the doors, we felt welcomed. We weren't just greeted; we were embraced. Over time, we became not only members but active volunteers—and now, I have the honor of serving as Council President.

To me, that is how St. Bart's shines its light in the South Ward: through genuine welcome, service, and love in action. We belong to each other because we lift one another up—through faith, through service, and through the simple act of being present for our neighbors and for each other.

One of the main challenges we face in feeding our neighbors is the growing need within our community and the fear many residents carry due to their legal status. Some are hesitant to come forward for help because they worry about being judged or being seen.

As a church that believes in acceptance and compassion, it's important that we continue building trust and showing that St. Bart's is a safe place for everyone.

Another challenge is ensuring we have enough resources to meet the needs of all who come to us. The demand keeps growing, and it's not something we can face alone. To truly sustain and expand our efforts, we need to strengthen our community partnerships. There are so many businesses, stores, and restaurants right here in our area that could become incredible allies in this mission.

By building those relationships—whether through food donations, sponsorships, or shared volunteer efforts—we can extend our reach and deepen our impact. What we need most is support in outreach: connecting with local partners, spreading awareness about what we do, and inviting others to join in the work. Together, we can continue to feed both body and spirit in these uncertain times.

I believe that St. Bart's greatest strength right now lies in our people—especially our wonderful volunteers. Their dedication, compassion, and willingness to serve are what make our outreach possible. In particular, having volunteers who speak Spanish has been an incredible asset. Being able to connect directly with our largely Spanish-speaking community builds trust and fosters genuine relationships. That bridge of language and understanding allows us to reach hearts as well as hands, and it has an immeasurable impact on what we're able to accomplish together.

Message From Council President

I would love to see all of the Council members become more actively involved in all of our ministries—through participation and presence. When our leadership is visible and engaged, it inspires others to follow their example. I'd also like to see more of our members involved in ministry work. Each person brings unique gifts, and the more we encourage everyone to take part, the stronger our community becomes.

Beyond that, I think it's important for both the Council and members to come forward with new and creative ideas for engagement—ways we can connect with our neighbors that go beyond our food ministries. Recreation and fellowship opportunities for both adults and children could help strengthen our sense of community. Events like our community BBQ or themed gatherings are great examples of how we can bring people together, build relationships, and continue shining our light in South Ward.

Looking ahead five years, I would love to see St.
Bart's expand its mission beyond being a place of
worship to becoming a true community hub. While
it may be ambitious, I envision our food ministry
growing into a full community center that operates
with regular hours and offers a range of supportive
services.

In addition to our Friday and Saturday food distributions, I'd love to see St. Bart's provide job search assistance, life skills training, youth programs, and emergency support for families in crisis. These kinds of services would allow us to meet people where they are—not only feeding their physical needs but also helping them build stability and hope for the future.

In five years, I hope St. Bart's continues to be known as a place that welcomes, uplifts, and empowers the South Ward community—a place where faith and action truly come together. Some of the toughest obstacles St. Bart's faces are deeply connected to the challenges within the South Ward community itself. Many of our neighbors are struggling with food insecurity, unemployment, housing instability, and limited access to resources. These challenges have only grown in recent years, and they directly impact the number of people turning to us for help. Without a doubt, the highlight of the year has been our partnership with Mercer Street Friends. This collaboration has allowed our food ministry to grow and expand in incredible ways, enabling us to serve more families and meet the increasing needs of our community. It's been inspiring to see what we can accomplish when we work together toward a shared mission of compassion and service. Looking ahead, I'm excited for the day when we're able to purchase a box truck to help with donation pickups and further strengthen our outreach efforts.

I would like to emphasize that during these uncertain times, now more than ever, we are called to live out the teachings Jesus shared during His Sermon on the Mount. His words remind us of who we are meant to be—people of light, compassion, and faith. Jesus said, "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden." (Matthew 5:14). That call feels especially relevant today. As members of St. Bart's, we are that light in the South Ward—through our kindness, our service, and our willingness to stand beside our neighbors in need.

Enid's Food Pantry

Message From Our Pantry Coordinator

Our Food Pantry is alive and well. This is one of the biggest ministries of St. Bart's. Since last reporting Enid's Pantry has partnered with Mercer Street Friends which has multiplied the amount of food we offer those facing food insecurity.

When you go into the fellowship hall you may notice many changes. We've acquired more cabinets and freezers and have tried to rearrange the area to meet the increasing need of pantry space, while still creating a spacious fellowship area.

As you know we still hold pantry the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month and the Farmers Market every Friday morning during the growing season. Three times since the summer we have also given out fresh fish. The need is apparent.

Each Saturday pantry we are serving 130 to 150 households. This adds up to feeding over 1,050 people a month. Our Friday Farmer's Market hands out produce to roughly the same amount of people per week. That adds up to more than 3,000 people a month.

Of course none of this would be possible without the help of all our volunteers, to all that contribute monetarily and to our friends from other Lutheran churches. Much time and physical labor goes into making the pantry run smoothly and efficiently. So my personal thanks goes to all.

As always if you have any questions feel free to see me, or Kristen Arcos. We will be happy to help. God Bless us with being able to continue this ministry and build trust and respect in the community.








