Reader Two: In the face of grief, in the face of loss, we light a candle of joy... (Light the third candle in Advent wreath.)


Reader One: May the light from this candle overwhelm the world.





Apostle's Creed

- P Let us all affirm our faith by using the words of the Apostles' Creed:
- C I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. hear our prayer.

When bodies weaken and hearts grow fearful, speak your blessing. (We pray especially for Joe, Nick, Bob, Justin, Billy, Gloria, Rosemary, Nelson, Tom, Shirley, Rich, Heather, and Gail). In uncertain times, remind us of the promise spoken to our ancestors in faith. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

When people are imprisoned or held captive, break the chains and offer release. Strengthen the work of the church in restorative justice, breaking cycles of poverty, and welcoming the immigrant (*especially Global Refuge and Lutheran Social Services*). God of grace,

hear our prayer.

We pray for our partner churches: Abiding Presence and Prince of Peace; We pray for our Bishop Christa Compton; We also pray for the concerns of this congregation: those who travel, those absent from worship, those celebrating birthdays, *especially Violet Teschke*, and for those celebrating anniversaries; also for the people of God in this place and for other needs in our community. God of grace, **hear our prayer.**

At this time, you may offer up prayers for loved ones, thanksgivings to God, or any other intercessions silently or aloud... (Pause) God of grace, hear our prayer.

As we await your coming, we give thanks for the faithful who have lived and died in. May their boldness of faith inspire our witness and work. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

(**Pastor**) Draw near to us, O God, as we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy through Jesus Christ, Emmanuel.


